PROCLAMATION.

BY

HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

No. 33, 1907.—DATED 21st OCTOBER, 1907.

**Preamble.**

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Proclamation of the High Commissioner for South Africa dated the fifteenth day of November, 1893, relating to the granting of permits authorising the purchase or receipt by natives of ammunition in the Bechuanaland Protectorate (hereinafter referred to as the said Proclamation):

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby proclaim, declare and make known as follows:—

**Amending Proclamation of 15th November, 1893.**

1. Sections *four, six, nine, ten, and twelve* of the said Proclamation shall be, and are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the term "Resident Commissioner" wherever the same occurs in the said sections.

**Addition to Section 10.**

2. Section *ten* of the said Proclamation shall be and is hereby further amended by the insertion therein, after the words "sales or supplies of ammunition to natives by him" of the words "during the last preceding month."

**Addition to Section 12.**

3. Section *twelve* of the said Proclamation shall be and is hereby further amended by the addition at the end thereof of the following paragraph:—

"(i) Neglecting or failing to deliver or cause to be delivered within the first fourteen days of any month to the Assistant Commissioner or Magistrate having jurisdiction over the place where such licensed dealer shall reside, a return or account as mentioned in section *ten* hereof of the sales or supplies of ammunition to natives by him during the last preceding month."

**Resident Commissioner may authorise any person to do anything competent for a magistrate to do.**

4. The Resident Commissioner may from time to time authorise in writing any person approved by him to do all acts or things which a Magistrate is by the said Proclamation empowered to do and may from time to time withdraw such authority, and any person so authorised shall while such authority continues be deemed to be a Magistrate for all purposes of the said Proclamation.

**Commencement of Proclamation.**

5. This Proclamation shall be read as one with the said Proclamation, and shall have force and effect from the date of its publication in the "Gazette."
