

PROCLAMATION.

BY

HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

No. 50, 1907.—DATED 24th DECEMBER, 1907.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the High Commissioner's Proclamation of July 4th, 1893, making provision for the establishment of the Office of Registrar of Deeds for the Bechuanaland Protectorate with a view to the removal of such office from Vryburg in British Bechuanaland, to Mafeking;

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

PROCLAMATIONS.

Amendment of section two of Proclamation of 4th July, 1893.

1. Section two of the High Commissioner's Proclamation of 4th July, 1893, shall be and is hereby amended by deleting therefrom, the words "for the time being filling the Office of the Registrar of Deeds in the Territory of British Bechuanaland," and substituting therefor the words "appointed by the High Commissioner to the Office of Registrar of Deeds for the Bechuanaland Protectorate."

Short title and date of taking effect.

2. This Proclamation may be cited for all purposes as "The Deeds Office Amendment Proclamation, 1907," and shall be read as one with the said Proclamation of 4th July, 1893, and shall have force and take effect as from the 1st day of January, 1908.

Preamble.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the High Commissioner's Proclamations of the 10th of June, 1891, and the 4th of July, 1893, the provisions of the "Transfer Duty Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1884," of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope are in force in the Bechuanaland Protectorate (hereinafter referred to as "the Protectorate");

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the "Transfer Duty Reduction Act, 1896," of the said Colony, whereby the said "Transfer Duty Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1884," was amended by substituting for the words "four pounds" in section two of the said Act the words "two pounds" should also be in force in the Protectorate;

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

Applying the provisions of Cape Act No. 10 of 1896.

1. The provisions of the "Transfer Duty Reduction Act, 1896," of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope shall *mutatis mutandis* be in force and have effect within the limits of the Protectorate.

Commencement of Proclamation.

2. This Proclamation shall have force and take effect as from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
