

PROCLAMATION.¹

BY

HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

No. 54, 1910.—DATED 3rd OCTOBER, 1910.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the High Commissioner's Proclamation dated the 18th day of November, 1891, providing for the commutation and carrying out of sentences imposed by Criminal Courts in the Bechuanaland Protectorate;

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

Amending Proclamation of 18th November, 1891.

1. Section *one* of the High Commissioner's Proclamation dated the 18th day of November, 1891, shall be and is hereby amended as follows:—

- (a) By inserting after the word "commute" the words "or remit";
- (b) by inserting after the figures "1891" the words "or to grant a pardon either free or subject to lawful conditions to any offender convicted by any such Court."

Commencement of Proclamation.

2. This Proclamation shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
