

PROCLAMATION.<sup>1</sup>

HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

No. 1, ADMINISTRATION—DATED 12th APRIL, 1912.

**Preamble.**

WHEREAS the Fencing Act, 1883 (Act No. 30 of 1883) of the Cape of Good Hope is in force *mutatis mutandis* in the Bechuanaland Protectorate;

And whereas it is expedient that the Provisions of Part I of the said Act should be declared to be in operation in that part of the Southern District of the Bechuanaland Protectorate known as the Gaberones Block;

And whereas the powers conferred by section four of the said Act on the Governor of the Cape of Good Hope are exercisable under the said Act as in force in the Bechuanaland Protectorate by the High Commissioner;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested under section *four* of the said Act as in force in the Bechuanaland Protectorate, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

PROCLAMATIONS.

**Part I of the Cape Fencing Act, 1883, applied to the Gaberones Block.**

1. From and after the date of the taking effect of this Proclamation the provisions of Part I of the Fencing Act, 1883 (Act No. 30 of 1883) of the Cape of Good Hope shall be in operation *mutatis mutandis* within the limits of that portion of the southern district of the Bechuanaland Protectorate known as the Gaberones Block the boundaries of which are described in the schedule to Proclamation No. 12 of 1905 dated the 7th day of June, 1905.

**Commencement of Proclamation.**

2. This Proclamation shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
