

PROCLAMATION.

BY

HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

No. 35, 1913.—DATED 18th NOVEMBER, 1913.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the suspension of pensions granted under Proclamation No. 26 of 1906 or any amendment thereof to persons who have been employed in the service of the Government of the Bechuanaland Protectorate (hereinafter referred to as the Protectorate) in the event of such persons becoming directors of companies operating in the Protectorate or being employed by any such company in the Protectorate without the permission of the High Commissioner first had and obtained;

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers, in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

Providing for the suspension of pensions in certain cases.

1. If any person to whom a pension has been granted under Proclamation No. 26 of 1906 or any amendment thereof becomes on his final retirement from the service of the Government of the Protectorate either a director of any company the principal part of whose business is in any way directly concerned with the Protectorate, or an officer or a servant employed in the Protectorate by any such company, without in every such case the permission of the High Commissioner in writing first had and obtained, then in every such case it shall be lawful for the High Commissioner with the approval of the Secretary of State to direct that such pension shall forthwith cease; provided always that it shall be lawful for the Secretary of State on being satisfied that the person in respect of whose pension any such direction shall have been given has ceased to be a director of such company or to be employed as an officer or servant of such company in the Protectorate, as the case may be, to give directions for the restoration of such pension with retrospective effect, if he shall see fit, to such a date as he shall specify.

Proclamation to read as one with Proclamation No. 26 of 1906. Commencement of Proclamation.

2. This Proclamation shall be read as one with Proclamation No. 26 of 1906 and the Proclamations amending the same and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
