

**PROCLAMATION.**

BY

**HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.**

**No. 47 of 1916.—PROMULGATED 8th DECEMBER, 1916.**

**Amending the Proclamation of the 10th of June, 1891, in regard to the issuing of trading licences and the fees payable thereon.**

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend in certain respects the Proclamation of the 10th of June, 1891 (herein after referred to as "the said Proclamation") in regard to the issuing of trading licences in the Bechuanaland Protectorate and the fees payable thereon;

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in section *twenty-three* of the said Proclamation no person shall be required to obtain a licence by reason only of his trading in the produce of lands within the Protectorate of which he is himself the lawful owner or occupier, or in articles manufactured within the Bechuanaland Protectorate from materials produced within the Protectorate.<sup>1</sup>
