PROCLAMATION

BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE HIGH COMMISSIONER

Entitled "The Treaties of Peace Orders (Further Amendment) Order (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation, 1922."

Whereas by the Treaty of Peace Order (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation, 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation 1921 and other Proclamations, the Treaty of Peace Order 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order 1921, and various Orders amending the said Orders have been modified in certain respects in their application to the Bechuanaland Protectorate (herein after referred to as "the territory");

And whereas it is expedient also to modify the Treaties of Peace Orders (Amendment) Order 1922 in its application to the territory;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. The Treaties of Peace Orders (Amendment) Order 1922 shall in its application to the territory be subject to the following modifications, that is to say:—

The references in article *one* of the said Order to previous Orders shall be read as references to such previous Orders as modified by any Proclamation in their application to the territory, and the quotations from previous Orders shall therefore be amended by the substitution in paragraphs (b) and (c) of the said article of the word "twenty" for the word "eighteen" and in paragraph (d) of the said article of the word "twelve" for the word "ten."

2. This Proclamation shall be deemed to have come into operation in relation to any Treaty of Peace on the date when such Treaty came into force.
