

## BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Royal Highness the High Commissioner

Amending Proclamation No. 5 of 1902 so as to give Resident Magistrates and Assistant Resident Magistrates jurisdiction to deal with cases arising under the Deserted Wives and Children Protection Act, 1895, of the Cape Colony, as in force in the Bechuanaland Protectorate.

Whereas it is expedient to amend Proclamation No. 5 of 1902 by giving Resident Magistrates and Assistant Magistrates as well as Assistant Commissioners jurisdiction to deal with cases arising under the Deserted Wives and Children Protection Act No. 7 of 1895 of the Cape Colony as in force in the Bechuanaland Protectorate;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Section *one* of the said Proclamation is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "Resident Magistrate or Assistant Resident Magistrate" after the words "Assistant Commissioner."
2. This Proclamation shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
