

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 61 of 1924.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.—CUSTOMS DUTIES.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *eight*, paragraph (1), of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Customs Tariff Proclamation, 1914 (No. 85 of 1914), as amended by section *twelve* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Customs and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1923 (No. 33 of 1923), His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that there shall be charged, levied, collected, and paid on

- (a) rock-drill, water, and air hoses;
- (b) delivery hoses, viz., acid, beer, steam, sand-blast, water, pneumatic-tool, radiator, wine and spirit proof, and oxy-acetylene;
- (c) suction hoses, rough and smooth bore, including wine and spirit proof hose;
- (d) railway hoses, viz., vacuum, tender-feed, car steam-heating, washout, and engine-spray,

on importation into the Bechuanaland Protectorate from the United States of America a special customs duty (or dumping duty) equal to the difference between the price at which the goods are sold for home consumption in the usual and ordinary course of trade in the principal markets of the United States of America at the time of shipment plus the free on board charges and the selling price of the goods free on board to an importer in the Bechuanaland Protectorate or in the Union; provided that the special customs duty (or dumping duty) shall not in any case exceed twenty-five per cent. *ad valorem*.

The provisions of this notice shall not have force or effect in respect of any of the aforesaid goods exported from the United States of America prior to the date of the publication hereof in the *Gazette*.
