

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 63 of 1924.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.—CUSTOMS DUTY.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *eight*, paragraph (1), of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Customs Tariff Proclamation, 1914 (No. 85 of 1914), as amended by section *twelve* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Customs and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1923 (No. 33 of 1923), His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that from and after the date of the publication of this notice in the *Gazette* there shall be charged, levied, collected, and paid on cement imported into the Bechuanaland Protectorate from Canada or from Germany a special customs or dumping duty equal to the difference between the price at which cement of a like grade is sold for home consumption in the usual and ordinary course of trade in the principal markets of Canada or Germany, as the case may be, at the time of shipment plus the free on board charges and the selling price free on board to an importer in the Bechuanaland Protectorate or in the Union: Provided that the special customs or dumping duty shall not in any case exceed twenty-five per cent. *ad valorem*; and provided further that the provisions of this notice shall not apply to cement which was exported to the Bechuanaland Protectorate from Canada or Germany prior to the date of publication hereof.
