PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The High Commissioner
Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Poll Tax Amendment
Proclamation, 1924.

Whereas it is desirable to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Poll Tax Proclamation, 1922 (No. 44 of 1922) (herein after referred to as the principal law);

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. In addition to his liability under section *four* of the principal law any person who shall refuse or neglect to pay the tax imposed by section *one* of the principal law within the prescribed time shall be guilty of an offence and shall upon conviction for a first offence be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds, or in default of payment to imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month, and on a subsequent offence to a fine not exceeding fifteen pounds, or in default of payment to imprisonment for a period not exceeding three months.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Poll Tax Amendment Proclamation, 1924, and shall be read as one with the principal law, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
