

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 167 of 1925.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the power vested in him by sections *three* (4) and *four* of Act No. 10 of 1911 of the Union of South Africa as applied to the Bechuanaland Protectorate by Proclamation No. 28 of 1916, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to approve of the introduction of a service for the exchange of agricultural parcels between Post Offices in the Bechuanaland Protectorate (with the exception of Maun, Kasane, and Ghanzi) and also between the Union of South Africa and the Bechuanaland Protectorate (with the exception of Maun, Kasane, and Ghanzi), with effect from the 20th November, 1925.

The regulations applicable to the service are those in force in the Union of South Africa, and the rates of postage will be as follows:—

For parcels exchanged between Bechuanaland Protectorate Offices—

parcels weighing up to 3 lb., 6d.; 7 lb., 9d.; 11 lb., 1s.;

for parcels exchanged between the Bechuanaland Protectorate and the Union of South Africa—

parcels weighing up to 3 lb., 1s.; 7 lb., 1s. 6d.; 11 lb., 2s.
