PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the High Commissioner

Providing for the suspension of the duty on cattle exported from the Bechuanaland Protectorate.

Whereas by Proclamation No. 12 of 1916 (herein after referred to as the "said Proclamation") provision was made for the payment of a duty upon every head of horned cattle exported from the Bechuanaland Protectorate;

And whereas it is desirable to empower the High Commissioner to suspend the operation of the said Proclamation, as amended by subsequent Proclamations, for such period or periods as to him may appear expedient;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. It shall be lawful for the High Commissioner, by notice in the *Gazette* to suspend for any period the operation of the said Proclamation should it appear expedient to him to do so, but such suspension shall not affect the validity of any act done or proceedings pending at the date thereof or the recovery of any duty or penalty payable at such date.

2. This Proclamation shall be read as one with the said Proclamation, and shall have force and take effect from the 1st day of April, 1925.
