## PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate Acting Appointments  
Proclamation, 1925.

Whereas it is expedient to make provision for the temporary appointment of a Magistrate or Assistant Magistrate during the absence or incapacity through sickness or other cause of a Magistrate or Assistant Magistrate in the Bechuanaland Protectorate;

Now, therefore, under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. (1) Whenever by reason of absence or incapacity through sickness or other cause any Magistrate or Assistant Magistrate within the Bechuanaland Protectorate is unable to discharge the duties of his office the Resident Commissioner may transfer any other Magistrate or Assistant Magistrate to act in his stead or the High Commissioner may appoint some other person to act as Magistrate or Assistant Magistrate during such absence or incapacitation.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in section *seven* of the Proclamation of 10th June, 1891, any Magistrate or Assistant Magistrate so transferred and any other person so appointed shall from the date of his transfer or appointment have full power and authority to act in the place of the Magistrate or Assistant Magistrate absent or incapacitated.

2. For the purpose of this Proclamation the term Magistrate or Assistant Magistrate shall include any person acting in either capacity.

3. This Proclamation may be cited for all purposes as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Acting Appointments Proclamation 1925 and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
