

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 116 of 1926.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

ADDITIONAL CUSTOMS DUTY ON CERTAIN SUGARS.

It is hereby notified for general information that by section *three* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation No. 20 of 1925 as amended by the Customs Tariff (Amendment) Proclamation, No. 15 of 1926, the High Commissioner may by notice in the *Gazette* bring into operation any duty referred to as a suspended duty in the First Schedule to that Proclamation and that His Excellency has been pleased to declare that from and after the twenty-second day of September, 1926, there shall be charged, levied, collected, and paid a customs duty at the rate of three shillings and sixpence per 100 lb. in addition to the ordinary duty of four shillings and sixpence per 100 lb. set forth in the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, on all sugars, other than candy, loaf, castor, icing and cube sugar, and golden and maple syrup, molasses, saccharum, glucose and treacle imported or taken out of bond, provided that such additional duty shall not be imposed in respect of the aforementioned sugars shipped to the Bechuanaland Protectorate prior to the above-mentioned date.
