

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 20 of 1926.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

ADDITIONAL CUSTOMS DUTY ON BENTWOOD CHAIRS.

It is hereby notified for general information that, by section *three* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, No. 20 of 1925, the High Commissioner may by notice in the *Gazette* bring into operation any duty referred to as a suspended duty in the First Schedule to that Proclamation, and that His Excellency has been pleased to declare that from and after the eighteenth day of February, 1926, there shall be charged, levied, collected, and paid a customs duty at the rate of one shilling on each bentwood chair imported or taken out of bond, in addition to the *ad valorem* duty of *twenty per cent.* set forth in the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, provided that this additional duty shall not be imposed in respect of bentwood chairs shipped to the Bechuanaland Protectorate prior to the above-mentioned date.
