ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS MADE BY HIS EXCELLENCY
THE HIGH COMMISSIONER IN PURSUANCE OF THE
POWERS IN HIM VESTED BY SECTION TWO OF THE
BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE DISEASES OF
STOCK PROCLAMATION, 1926.

93. No person shall remove or attempt to remove any cattle from the Ngamiland or the Chobe Districts as defined under High Commissioner's Notice No. 119 of 1923 or any notice amending that notice (herein after referred to as the "said districts") for the purpose of export from the territory except under permit in writing to be obtained in every case from a Government veterinary officer. Any person contravening this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds or in default of payment to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a period not exceeding one month, or to such imprisonment without the option of a fine for every such head of cattle removed or attempted to be removed.

94. The owner of any cattle intended to be removed from the said districts for the purpose of export from the territory, except to the Union of South Africa, shall before the issue of the permit mentioned in the last preceding regulation bring such cattle to a place to be appointed by the Government veterinary officer by whom the permit is to be issued at a reasonable distance from the place where they are kept for inspection by him.

95. For any inspection under regulation No. 94 there shall be charged a fee of one shilling for each head of cattle so inspected which shall be payable on demand by the intending exporter of such cattle and which if not paid within one month after demand made shall be recoverable in any competent Court at the suit of the Resident Commissioner. For the purpose of this regulation "exporter" shall mean any person or body of persons whether corporate or unincorporate who or which exports cattle from the territory on his or its own behalf or on whose behalf any person exports cattle from the territory.

96. The fee imposed under regulation No. 95 shall be leviable also in respect of any inspection of cattle intended for export from the territory which has been made by a Government veterinary officer on or since the ninth day of June, 1926, and before the promulgation of these regulations.
