BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE CUSTOMS.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under the powers vested in him by section *twelve* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925 (No. 20 of 1925), as amended by the Customs Management and Tariff (Amendment) Proclamation, 1927 (No. 37 of 1927), His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that the rebate of duty as set forth hereunder shall be allowed subject to the subjoined regulations.

**REBATE OF CUSTOMS DUTY ON UNIFORMS IMPORTED
FOR GIRL GUIDE ASSOCIATIONS.**

(1) A rebate of the full duty shall be allowed on uniforms imported by or on behalf of any recognized Girl Guide or similar association on a certificate signed by the secretary or officer in charge of such association that the uniforms are intended solely for the use of members of such association, and on an undertaking that, if any of these uniforms are otherwise sold or disposed of in the Union or in the territory, the duty rebated thereon will forthwith be paid to the Director of Customs.

(2) The secretary or officer referred to in paragraph (1) shall keep a book showing the receipts and disposals of such uniforms, which book shall be open for inspection to an officer of customs at any time.

Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of this notice shall, in terms of section *fifty-nine* of the Customs Management Proclamation, 1914, be liable to a fine not exceeding three hundred pounds and to the forfeiture of the goods.
