BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE PUBLIC HEALTH
REGULATIONS.

Every person in whose house or premises any person is suffering or suspected to be suffering from typhus fever, smallpox, cerebro-spinal meningitis, or plague (whether bubonic or pneumonic) and every person having the charge or care of a person so suffering or suspected to be suffering shall forthwith notify the magistrate of the district of the fact that the said person is so suffering or suspected to be suffering. This regulation shall not apply in the case of persons under treatment in any hospital.
