

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 79 OF 1927.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by sections *three* (4) and *four* of Act No. 10 of 1911 of the Union of South Africa as applied to the Bechuanaland Protectorate by Proclamation No. 28 of 1916, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to approve of the introduction of a service for the exchange of agricultural parcels between Southern Rhodesia and the Bechuanaland Protectorate (with the exception of Maun, Kasane, and Ghanzi), with effect from the 1st August, 1927.

The regulations applicable to the service are those in force in Southern Rhodesia, and the rates of postage will be as follows:—

For a parcel not exceeding 2 lb., 3d. ;

for a parcel not exceeding 3 lb., 6d. ;

and 3d. for each additional pound thereafter, up to a maximum of 11 lb.
