PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the High Commissioner

Amending in certain respects Proclamation No. 10 of 1919 regulating the entry of natives into the Bechuanaland Protectorate.

Whereas it is desirable to amend in certain respects Proclamation No. 10 of 1919 regulating the entry of natives into the Bechuanaland Protectorate:—

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby proclaim, declare and make known as follows:—

1. Section *two* of Proclamation No. 10 of 1919 is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "twenty shillings" and the substitution therefor of the words "ten pounds" and further by the deletion of the words "fourteen days" and the substitution therefor of the words "two months"; and further by the addition of a new sub-section to follow the existing section which section shall hereafter be numbered as sub-section (1) of section *two*. The new sub-section shall read as follows:—

(2) Any Court of Resident Magistrate before which a native has been convicted of an offence under this Proclamation may in addition to any penalty imposed under sub-section (1) order the native so convicted to be returned to the territory from which he entered the Protectorate and for that purpose to be detained in custody for such time as may be reasonably necessary for the due execution of the order.

2. This Proclamation shall be read as one with Proclamation No. 10 of 1919 and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
