

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 39 OF 1929.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *seven* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Public Service Proclamation, 1924, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following additional regulation to Chapter VII of the Regulations as set forth in High Commissioner's Notice No. 145 of 1925:—

3. (a) Any officer or employee who is transferred or removed from one station to another may be reimbursed the difference between his normal living household expenses (comprising light, fuel, and food) and the abnormal expenses actually and necessarily incurred by him, either at his old or new station, through being compelled to reside in an hotel or boarding-house while his furniture and effects are being packed or are in the course of transit from one station to the other. Provided that no claim shall be entertained in respect of abnormal expenses incurred in this connection for a period in excess of six weeks, and that satisfactory evidence is produced that the expense could not have been avoided.
