**NOTICE.**

It is hereby notified for general information that under the provisions of section *one* of Proclamation No. 40 of 1913, as amended by Proclamation No. 35 of 1916, I do hereby order that all shops within a radius of two miles from the Chief's Kgotla at Serowe be closed on such days and at such hours as are hereinafter set forth:

All shops within the above-mentioned area shall close between the hours 1 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. for the midday recess and at 5 p.m. for the rest of the day on every weekday except Saturdays when such shops shall close at 1 p.m. for the rest of the day.

This order shall take effect from the 15th day of May, 1929.
