

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

KANYE—MOSHUPA MOTOR ROAD.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by section *fourteen*, sub-sections (1) and (3) of Proclamation No. 10 of 1929, I do prohibit the use of motor-cars which, with their loads, exceed 4,000 lb. in weight, upon the public road hereinafter described and do declare the said road to be a motor road, viz. :—

Starting from a point 1,000 yards east of the Police Camp at Kanye on the Moshupa Road where the motor road and wagon road to Moshupa join, travelling to the east of the said wagon road crossing the cement drift at the Makodumo River; thence south-east crossing the same wagon road at right angles and continuing on the east until the motor road again meets the wagon road $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Kanye. From the foot of Polokwe Hill where the sign "Motors Only" appears for a distance of 3 miles where the motor road again joins the main wagon road. This notice to take effect from the 15th November, 1930.
