

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 119 OF 1930.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

DUMPING DUTY ON WHEATEN FLOUR FROM  
AUSTRALIA.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *two* of the Customs Tariff (Amendment) Proclamation No. 15 of 1926, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that, from and after the seventeenth day of September, 1930, there shall be charged, levied, collected, and paid on wheaten flour on importation into the Bechuanaland Protectorate from Australia a dumping duty equal to the excess over seven pence per 100 lb. of the difference between the export prices free on board and the domestic value thereof as defined by section *nineteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation No. 20 of 1925, provided that—

- (i) no dumping duty shall be imposed in respect of flour shipped to the Bechuanaland Protectorate from Australia prior to the above-mentioned date; and
- (ii) such dumping duty shall not exceed one-half of the value of the goods for duty purposes as defined in section *fourteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925.
