

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 57 OF 1930.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

**ADDITIONAL CUSTOMS DUTY ON DISINFECTANTS
IMPORTED IN BULK.**

It is hereby notified for general information that, by section *three* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925 (No. 20 of 1925), as amended, the High Commissioner may by notice in the *Gazette* bring into operation any duty referred to as a suspended duty in the First Schedule to that Proclamation, and that His Excellency has been pleased to declare that from and after the thirtieth day of May, 1930, there shall be charged, levied, collected and paid a customs duty at the rate of fifteen per cent. *ad valorem* in addition to the ordinary duty set forth in item 223 (a) of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, on—

liquid disinfectants and disinfectant powders, in bulk, the active ingredients of which are derivatives of coal tar, imported or taken out of bond, provided that this additional duty shall not be imposed in respect of such disinfectants as were shipped to the Bechuanaland Protectorate prior to the above-mentioned date.
