

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 77 of 1930.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

REBATE OF CUSTOMS DUTIES.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under the powers vested in him by section *twelve* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925 (No. 20 of 1925), as amended by section *two* of the Customs Tariff (Amendment) Proclamation, 1930 (No. 16 of 1930), His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that from and after the Twentieth day of June, 1930, the rebates of duty as set forth hereunder shall be allowed subject to the following regulations:—

I.

GOODS IMPORTED FOR ROAD CONSTRUCTION OR MAINTENANCE.

A rebate of the full duty shall be allowed on steam wagons and motor trucks and chassis therefor with or without tyres (one tyre fitted to each wheel), trailers and road rollers, imported for or taken out of bond by any local authority for use in road construction or maintenance provided that the relative customs bill of entry bears a certificate signed by the secretary of the Council, Borough or Board, as the case may be, and countersigned by the chairman thereof, that the goods are to be used solely on road construction or maintenance by the said Council, Borough or Board; and on a written undertaking to the effect that if any such steam wagons and motor trucks and chassis therefor or vehicles of which the chassis forms a part, trailers or road rollers are sold or otherwise disposed of by the said Council, Borough or Board, the Director of Customs will be advised in writing of such sale or disposal and that customs duty at the rate leviable at the date of sale or disposal will be immediately paid to him by such Council, Borough or Board.

II.

MATERIAL FOR UNIFORMS FOR MEMBERS OF THE SOUTH AFRICAN RED CROSS SOCIETY.

- (1) A rebate of the full duty shall be allowed on material for uniforms imported by or on behalf of the South African Red Cross Society, on a certificate signed by the secretary or officer in charge of that society that the materials are intended solely for the manufacture of uniforms for the use of members of such society, and on an undertaking that if any of these materials are otherwise sold or disposed of in the Union or the Territory, the duty rebated thereon will forthwith be paid to the Director of Customs.
- (2) The secretary or officer referred to in paragraph (1) shall keep a book showing the receipts and disposals of such material, the number of uniforms made therefrom, and the disposal of such uniforms, which book shall be open for inspection to an officer of customs at any time.

Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of this notice shall, in terms of section *fifty-nine* of the Customs Management Proclamation, 1914, be liable to a fine not exceeding three hundred pounds and to the forfeiture of the goods.

The regulations contained in Part I of High Commissioner's Notice No. 87 of 1929 are hereby repealed.
