PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER

Amending further the Bechuanaland Protectorate Pensions Proclamation, 1924.

Whereas it is expedient to amend further the Bechuanaland Protectorate Pensions Proclamation, 1924, as amended by Proclamation No. 11 of 1926 and Proclamation No. 27 of 1926, hereinafter referred to as the principal law.

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in sections *three* and *four* of the principal law, any hospital matron or staff nurse who by virtue of the provisions of this Proclamation is entitled to pension under section *two* of the principal law may retire or be required to retire at or after the age of fifty.
2. Notwithstanding anything contained in section *eight* of the principal law the pension to be granted to hospital matrons and staff nurses shall be calculated at the rate of one-fiftieth of the annual salary and emoluments of the office for each completed year of service.
3. Section *ten* of the principal law shall, for the purposes of this Proclamation, be read as if the word "fiftieths" were substituted for the word "fifty-fifths" wherever it occurs and the word "forty" for the word "forty-five."
4. The Second Schedule to the principal law shall be and is hereby amended by the addition of "hospital matrons and staff nurses" at the end thereof.
5. The Third Schedule to the said principal law shall be and is hereby amended by the addition of "nurses," "hospital cooks," "mechanics," and "washerwomen" at the end of the third paragraph thereof, and by the substitution of "ward attendants" for "hospital orderlies."
6. This Proclamation may be cited for all purposes as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Pensions Further Amendment Proclamation 1930, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
