PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the High Commissioner

Amending the Bechuanaland Protectorate Insolvency
Proclamation, 1929 (No. 25 of 1929).

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Insolvency Proclamation, 1929 (No. 25 of 1929) (hereinafter referred to as the said Proclamation);

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Sub-section (1) of section *ten* of the said Proclamation is hereby amended by adding the following proviso thereto:—

“ Provided that if the debtor intends to oppose such application on the return day he shall give the Registrar of the Court not less than seven days' notice in writing of such intention, and failing such notice he shall not be entitled to make any representations to the Magistrate on such return day, or to lead any evidence against such application.”

2. This Proclamation may be cited for all purposes as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Insolvency Amendment Proclamation of 1930 and shall commence and come into operation on the date of publication in the *Gazette*.
