

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 102 of 1931.

It is hereby notified for general information that under the provisions of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Radio Proclamation No. 10 of 1927, as amended by the Bechuanaland Protectorate Radio Amendment Proclamation No. 27 of 1931, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to cancel Regulation No. 17 of the Regulations for Radio "Broadcasting and listening and amateur Radio experimenting in the Bechuanaland Protectorate" published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 22 of 1927 and to substitute therefor the following new Regulation No. 17:—

17. The fees for a listener's licence shall be paid annually in advance, or in such instalments as may be arranged, at the following rates per annum:—

For other premises, or in special circumstances, such fees as the Postmaster-General may prescribe. (Where a zone boundary passes through a town, the municipal area shall be regarded as being wholly in the zone nearest to the broadcasting station.)
