

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 106 of 1931.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *two* (2) of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Diseases of Stock Proclamation No. 4 of 1926, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to add to the Regulations 1 and 2 published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 53 of 1931 the following new regulation:—

3. Railway cattle trucks from Southern Rhodesia shall only be allowed to enter the Bechuanaland Protectorate on the following conditions:—

- (a) That the truck has been thoroughly cleansed of all overlying loose material or refuse of any description, particularly dung or packing material.
- (b) That the inside of the truck has been thoroughly washed or sprayed with a 5 per cent. aqueous solution of kerosene or a similar strength of a disinfectant to be approved by the Administration and thereafter whitewashed.
- (c) That the cleansing and disinfection shall be performed upon each occasion the truck leaves any Rhodesia Railway point for the conveyance of goods within the Bechuanaland Protectorate.
- (d) That a declaration is affixed to the truck by an authority to be approved by the Administration that conditions (a), (b), and (c) have been complied with.

Any person contravening or failing to comply with or being guilty of an offence against the above Regulation or the Regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 53 of 1931 (all of which shall be read as one with the Diseases of Stock Regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 28 of 1926) shall be liable to the penalties provided in Regulation 71 of the said Diseases of Stock Regulations.
