

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 40 of 1931.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under the provisions of section *two* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Proclamation, No. 21 of 1927, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following regulation to be inserted after regulation No. 102 of the regulations published under High Commissioner's Notice No. 57 of 1927, such regulation to be numbered 102 (a) and to be as follows:—

Any prisoner who escapes or attempts to escape or conspires with any person to procure the escape of any prisoner from any prison in which he is placed or from any port place or conveyance where he may be for the purpose of detention or labour or who is in possession of any instrument or thing with intent to procure his own escape or that of another prisoner shall be liable on conviction to imprisonment with hard labour for a period not exceeding two years to be served at the expiration of his current sentence and in addition if his escape or attempt to escape was accompanied by any act or threat of violence to corporal punishment not exceeding fifteen strokes.
