

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 67 of 1931.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the provisions of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Flour and Meal Importation Restriction Proclamation, 1931, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following regulations with effect from the date of publication thereof.

His Excellency the High Commissioner has been further pleased to prohibit the importation into the Bechuanaland Protectorate of any wheaten flour or wheaten meal without a permit in writing therefor issued by the Resident Commissioner in terms of the subjoined regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall import any wheaten flour or wheaten meal into the Bechuanaland Protectorate without a permit in writing therefor given by the Resident Commissioner.

2. Applications in writing for such permits shall be addressed to the Director of Customs, Bechuanaland Protectorate, Mafeking, and shall contain the following particulars:—

- (a) The quantity, description, grade or quality and purchase price of the flour or meal to be imported, including freight and insurance;
- (b) the country of origin and port of shipment of the flour or meal;
- (c) the port of landing in South Africa and the place of destination of the flour or meal;
- (d) the purpose for which the flour or meal is to be used;
- (e) the quantities of the same class or flour or meal imported by the applicant during each of the three calendar years prior to his application and during the current year up to date of his application;
- (f) the separate quantities of other classes of flour or meal including flour or meal milled in the Union or the Bechuanaland Protectorate used by him during the same period; and
- (g) the proportions of flour or meal milled in the Union or the Bechuanaland Protectorate and the flour or meal to be imported, if it is required for blending.
