

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 76 of 1931.

It is hereby notified for general information that under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *two* (2) of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Diseases of Stock Proclamation No. 4 of 1926 His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following amendments and additions to the Regulations published in High Commissioner's Notice No. 53 of 1931:—

- (i) By the insertion of the words "but excepting butter and cheese" between the words "manure" and "is" in Regulation No. 1; and
- (ii) by the addition of a further regulation as follows:—

3. Butter and cheese may be imported from Southern Rhodesia into and in transit through the Bechuanaland Protectorate provided:—

- (1) (a) That the milk or cream used for the manufacture of the butter has not been derived from herds within a radius of 25 miles from the nearest foot-and-mouth disease infection and that such milk or cream has been pasteurized;
- (b) that the butter has been kept entirely separate and distinct from butter manufactured for consumption in Southern Rhodesia;
- (2) that the milk used for the manufacture of the cheese has not been derived from any herd infected with foot-and-mouth disease or from any herd in the neighbourhood of an infected herd;
- (3) that each consignment is accompanied by a certificate issued by a Government Veterinary Officer of Southern Rhodesia to the effect that the above-mentioned conditions have been complied with.
