PROCLAMATION

By His EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER

Further amending the High Commissioner's Proclamation of the 12th of December, 1892, as amended by Proclamations No. 12 of 1898, No. 23 of 1914, No. 44 of 1919, and No. 48 of 1927.

Whereas it is desirable further to amend the High Commissioner's Proclamation of the 12th of December 1892, as amended by Proclamations No. 12 of 1898, No. 23 of 1914, No. 44 of 1919, and No. 48 of 1927 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law);

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Section *two* of the principal law is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

2. There shall be paid by every person using or carrying a gun in the Bechuanaland Protectorate in the case of residents of the Bechuanaland Protectorate who have resided therein not less than twelve months immediately prior to the grant of a licence and of officials of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Administration the sum of one pound, and in the case of all other persons, two pounds, to be collected by means of a licence to be taken out yearly and to be granted by a Magistrate.

2. Proclamations No. 44 of 1919 and No. 48 of 1927 are hereby repealed.

3. This Proclamation shall, save in regard to licences already taken out for the year 1931, have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
