PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER

Amending the Second Schedule of the Liquor Licensing Act, No. 28 of 1883, of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope as in force in the Bechuanaland Protectorate by virtue of the provisions of section *five* of the Proclamation of the 4th April, 1892.

Whereas it is desirable to amend the second Schedule of the Liquor Licensing Act No. 28 of 1883 of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope as in force in the Bechuanaland Protectorate by virtue of the provisions of Section 5 of the Proclamation of the 4th April, 1892 (hereinafter called "the principal law");

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal law there shall be paid to the Bechuanaland Protectorate Administration yearly as from the 1st day of January, 1932, the sum of thirty-five pounds for any retail liquor licence issued in respect of any place or premises not within the limits of any Municipality.

2. This Proclamation shall be read as one with the principal law and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
