

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 1 of 1932.

It is notified for general information that consequent upon representation made to the Union Government by the High Commissioner the Union Government have agreed to receive on behalf of the several Administrations and to deal with claims for payment of export subsidies on primary products originating in and removed from the Territories of Basutoland, Swaziland, and the Bechuanaland Protectorate to the Union for export oversea.

Applications for payment of the subsidy on the primary products mentioned in Schedules I and II to regulation No. 1 of Union Government Notice No. 1969 of 1931, should be addressed and sent by post to the Secretary for Agriculture, Exports Subsidies Branch, Pretoria, be made on the prescribed forms in duplicate and be accompanied by the evidence required under the said notice. If the claim is passed, payment of the subsidy will be made to the person entitled to receive it under those regulations, except in the case of goods produced in Basutoland which are listed in Schedule I of regulation No. 1 above, when the claim will be dealt with in accordance with regulation No. 7.

Applications for payment of the subsidy on primary products produced in the Territories of Swaziland and the Bechuanaland Protectorate removed direct therefrom to Northern or Southern Rhodesia, the Belgian Congo or to Portuguese East Africa, should be made to the Resident Commissioner of the territory concerned. Such applications should also be made on the prescribed forms and be accompanied by the evidence required under the above-mentioned Union Government Notice.

The subsidy should be computed at the rate of 10 per cent. on the value at the place of despatch of the goods exported.

Each application should be confined to a particular commodity or class of commodities.
