

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 17 OF 1932.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under the powers in him vested by section *two* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Diseases of Stock Proclamation, 1926 (No. 4 of 1926), His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following regulation to be called "The Stock-Free Zones Regulation":—

No owner of stock shall introduce or move or cause or allow to be introduced or moved any stock into or within any area declared by the Resident Commissioner by Notice in the *Gazette* to be a Stock-Free Zone without the written permission of the Chief Veterinary Officer or his representative. Any person who shall introduce or move stock in contravention of this regulation or whose stock shall be found to have come into such area without such permission shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds or in default of payment to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a period not exceeding six months.
