

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 25 of 1932.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

IMPORTATION PROHIBITIONS.

It is hereby notified for general information that by subsection (2) of section *five* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Customs Management and Tariff (Amendment) Proclamation, 1927 (Proclamation No. 37 of 1927), the High Commissioner may, by notice in the *Gazette*, add to the list given therein of articles, the importation of which into the Bechuanaland Protectorate is prohibited unless the Resident Commissioner has permitted such importation, and that His Excellency has been pleased to declare that the undermentioned articles are dangerous weapons within the terms of the above-quoted section:—

Knife blades with cutting edges of four inches or more in length.

Pocket knives, the blades of which can be fixed when opened. Any article so closely resembling a pistol or other fire-arm as to be calculated to give the impression that it is a genuine fire-arm, and cartridges (if any) for any such article.

Pistols or other devices for the discharge of a blinding, asphyxiating, lacrimating, incapacitating or virulent gas or liquid, and any cartridges for any such pistol or device.

Any device resembling a walking-stick, pen or other harmless article which is designed to conceal a blade or other lethal weapon, or to discharge or which can be adapted to discharge any projectile or a blinding, asphyxiating, lacrimating, incapacitating or virulent gas or liquid; and cartridges (if any) for any such device.

Rubber batons.

High Commissioner's Notice No. 131 of 1930 is hereby cancelled.
