HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 53 OF 1932.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under the provisions of section five of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Game Proclamation No. 17 of 1925, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to define the following area within which large and small game as specified in the Third and Fourth Schedule to the aforesaid Proclamation shall be protected for a period of three years from the 1st April, 1932:—

An area of about 6,000 square miles lying partly in the N'gamiland District and partly in the Chobe District within the following boundaries, viz.:—

Northern Boundary:

The Linyanti (or Chobe) River from its intersection on the west with the eastern border of the Batawana Reserve, that is, 10 miles west of the 24th degree of East Longitude to Kabulabula where the river intersects the 25th degree of East Longitude, a distance of about 70 miles.

Western Boundary:

A direct line north to south along the eastern boundary of the Batawana Reserve from its intersection with the Linyanti River about 20 miles south of the 18th parallel of Latitude to 10 miles south of the 19th parallel of Latitude about 50 miles.

Southern Boundary:

A direct line west to east 10 miles south of the 19th parallel of Latitude from its intersection with the border of the Batawana Reserve to Hendrik's Vlei on the Rhodesian Frontier, a distance of a little over 100 miles.

Eastern Boundary:

The Rhodesian boundary from Hendrik's Vlei to Stoffel's Pan, (about 70 miles), thence north-west to Kabulabula (about 25 miles).
