

## BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

No. 11 of 1932.

(Promulgated 18th March, 1932.)

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the High Commissioner

Prohibiting the manufacture, introduction and possession of certain intoxicating liquors in certain Native Reserves in the Bechuanaland Protectorate.

Whereas it is desirable to prohibit the manufacture, introduction and possession of certain intoxicating liquors, in certain Native Reserves in the Bechuanaland Protectorate;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. The High Commissioner may by notice in the *Gazette* specify any Native Reserve in the Bechuanaland Protectorate to which the provisions of this Proclamation shall apply and the said provisions shall apply accordingly within each such Reserve from the date fixed by the respective notice.

2. It shall not be lawful for any person to make, assist in making, cause to be made, bring into or have in his possession in any Reserve to which the provisions of this Proclamation shall apply any fermented liquor ~~made from the root~~ known as Khadi as defined in section three of Proclamation No. 73 of 1921, or any other intoxicating liquor not being Kafir beer which the High Commissioner may from time to time declare by Notice in the *Gazette* to be an intoxicating liquor for the purposes of this section.

3. Any person contravening the provisions of this Proclamation shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding ten pounds or in default of payment to imprisonment with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding two months.

4. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Liquor Law, Native Reserves Proclamation 1932, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
