PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER

Amending further the Bechuanaland Protectorate Poll Tax
Proclamation No. 44 of 1922.

Whereas it is desirable further to amend the Bechuanaland Protectorate Poll Tax Proclamation, 1922 (No. 44 of 1922) (which Proclamation as amended by Proclamation No. 15 of 1924 and Proclamation No. 34 of 1926 is hereinafter referred to as the principal law):

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Any person who fails to pay any instalment of the tax due under section *one* of the principal law before the expiration of one month after the date on which such instalment falls due, shall pay, in addition to the amount of tax due a further sum of two shillings for each month or part of a month after the tax has become due and payable.

2. Any additional sum which may become payable under the provisions of section *one* shall not exceed the amount of the original instalment of tax in respect of which it has become payable.

3. Such additional sum shall be payable by the person liable for the relative tax and may be sued for and recovered in any competent court as if it formed part of the instalment of tax in respect of which it has become payable.

4. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate Poll Tax Amendment Proclamation, 1932, and shall be read as one with the principal law and shall have force and take effect from the first day of July, 1932.
