PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The High Commissioner

Providing for the payment of a pension and a gratuity to Charles Leonard O'Brien Dutton, Esquire, in respect of his services as Government Secretary of the Bechuanaland Protectorate and in other capacities.

Whereas it is expedient to provide for the payment of a pension and a gratuity to Charles Leonard O'Brien Dutton, Esquire, in respect of his services as Government Secretary of the Bechuanaland Protectorate and in other capacities.

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. A pension at the rate of four hundred and twenty-nine pounds ten shillings and eleven pence per annum shall be and the same is hereby granted to the said Charles Leonard O'Brien Dutton as from the first day of April 1932 inclusive and in addition a gratuity of one thousand four hundred and thirty-one pounds sixteen shillings and fourpence shall be paid to him on the thirty-first day of March, 1932, in respect of his services as Government Secretary of the Bechuanaland Protectorate and in other capacities in the Office of the High Commissioner for South Africa.

2. The said pension and gratuity shall be payable out of the revenue of the Bechuanaland Protectorate.

3. Sections *twenty-five, twenty-six, twenty-seven* and *twenty-eight* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Pensions Proclamation, 1924, hereinafter referred to as the "said Proclamation" shall apply to the said pension as if the same were a pension granted under the provisions of the said Proclamation, and the said Charles Leonard O'Brien Dutton shall further be subject to the provisions of section *fourteen* of the said Proclamation in the same manner as if the said pension were a pension so granted.

4. The said pension shall be in substitution for any pension which might be claimable by the said Charles Leonard O'Brien Dutton under the provisions of the said Proclamation.

5. This Proclamation shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
