

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 120 of 1934.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *seven* of the Bechuanaland Protectorate Public Service Proclamation, 1924, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to make the following amendments in the regulations published under Chapter VII of High Commissioner's Notice No. 145 of 1925:—

GENERAL SUBSISTENCE AND TRANSPORT ALLOWANCE REGULATIONS.

1. Sub-sections (b) and (d) of section 2 are hereby cancelled.
2. Section 3 is hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor:—

“(i) Any officer (except as provided in the preceding regulation) who is not in receipt of a commuted travelling or subsistence allowance may, when travelling on duty in the Territory outside of his district, be granted subsistence allowance calculated at the appropriate rate under the following scale:—

Officers drawing annual salaries above £750	20s. 0d. per diem.
Officers drawing annual salaries of £501 to £750	17s. 6d. per diem.
Officers drawing annual salaries of £301 to £500	15s. 0d. per diem.
Officers drawing annual salaries of £300 or less	12s. 6d. per diem.

(ii) Any officer while absent from the Bechuanaland Protectorate on duty, whether he be travelling in the execution of his ordinary official duties or be on transfer from one station to another, or be engaged on relieving, special, or other duty, shall be granted an allowance for subsistence where such subsistence is not otherwise paid for by the Government calculated at the following rates:—

Officers holding appointments the maximum salary attached to which exceeds £600 per annum	20 0
Officers holding appointments the maximum salary attached to which exceeds £360 per annum, but does not exceed £600 per annum	15 0
Officers holding appointments the maximum salary attached to which does not exceed £360 per annum	12 6

An officer acting for another of a higher grade will draw the allowance appropriate to such higher grade.

For the purposes of this section the journey from Ramathlabama to Mafeking and any necessary detention in Mafeking shall be deemed to be travelling within the Territory.”
