It is hereby notified for general information that, under the powers vested in him by section *twelve* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925 (No. 20 of 1925), as amended, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that the rebates of duty as set forth hereunder shall be allowed subject to the subjoined regulations.

REBATE OF CUSTOMS DUTY ON MATERIAL IMPORTED FOR
NURSES' UNIFORMS.

(1) A rebate of the full duty shall be allowed on material for hospital nurses' uniforms imported by or on behalf of the board of a public hospital, and on a certificate signed by the secretary or authorized official of such board that the material is intended solely for the manufacture of nurses' uniforms for hospital use, and on an undertaking that if any of the material is otherwise used, sold, or disposed of in the territory, the duty rebated thereon will forthwith be paid to the Director of Customs; and

(2) the secretary or official referred to in paragraph (1) shall keep a book showing the receipts and disposals of such material, the yardage thereof, the number of nurses' uniforms made therefrom and the disposal of such uniforms, and the said book shall be open for inspection to an officer of customs at any time.

REBATE OF CUSTOMS DUTY ON ARTICLES CONSTRUCTED OR
ADAPTED FOR THE USE OF THE BLIND.

A rebate of the whole duty shall be allowed on articles specially constructed or adapted for the use of the blind, subject to the condition that on importation a certificate is given by the Government Secretary that the articles are specially constructed or adapted and are intended solely for the use of the blind.
