PROCLAMATION

BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

Entitled the Bechuanaland Protectorate General Dealers' Licences Amendment Proclamation, 1934.

Whereas it is expedient to amend in certain respects the Proclamation of the 10th June, 1891 (hereinafter referred to as the principal law) in relation to Trading Licences in the Bechuanaland Protectorate;

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Section *twenty-three* of the principal law is amended by adding the following proviso:

“ Provided, however, that no Mission, School or other educational institution shall be required to take out a licence in respect of the sale of goods produced or manufactured by the scholars or inmates of any such Mission, School or institution in the ordinary course of their education ”.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Bechuanaland Protectorate General Dealers' Licences Amendment Proclamation, 1934, and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
