

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 176 OF 1935.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

CUSTOMS.

DUMPING DUTY ON ROPE FROM THE PHILIPPINE ISLANDS.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *fifteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare, proclaim and make known that from and after the twenty-first day of October, 1935, there shall be charged, levied, collected and paid on rope on importation into the Bechuanaland Protectorate from the Philippine Islands an "ordinary" dumping duty equal to the difference between the "domestic value" and the "export price", as defined in section *nineteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, provided—

- (a) that such difference is greater than five per centum of the export price, and
- (b) that such duty shall not exceed one-half of the value for duty purposes of the rope as defined in section *fourteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, and
- (c) that such dumping duty shall not be imposed in respect of rope shipped to the Bechuanaland Protectorate from the Philippine Islands prior to the above-mentioned date.
