

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 180 of 1935.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

CUSTOMS.

FREIGHT DUMPING DUTY ON STEEL MANUFACTURES.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *fifteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that, from and after the eighth day of November, 1928, there shall be charged, levied, collected and paid on steel joists, channels, equal and unequal angles, rails and fishplates therefor, bars, flats, tees, galvanized and black sheets, castings and tubes on importation into the Bechuanaland Protectorate from Belgium, Luxemburg, Germany and France, freight dumping duty equal to the difference between the net freight paid or to be paid and the freight which would have been payable at the rate prevailing at the date of shipment for those classes of goods usually rated for shipping purposes on the same basis: Provided that such duty shall not exceed one-half of the value for duty purposes as defined in section *fourteen* of the aforesaid Proclamation; and provided further that such dumping duty shall not be imposed in respect of such steel manufactures shipped to the Bechuanaland Protectorate prior to the above-mentioned date.
