

## BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

No. 36 of 1935.

(Promulgated 5th July, 1935.)

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the High Commissioner

Entitled the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Amendment Proclamation, 1935.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Proclamation 1934 (No. 68 of 1934) (hereinafter referred to as the said Proclamation):

Now therefore under and by virtue of the powers in me vested, I do hereby declare, proclaim and make known as follows:—

1. Sub-section (2) of section *two* of the said Proclamation shall be and is hereby amended by the addition of the following provisos:—

“ Provided that in the case of any monument or relic situate in a Native Reserve, such consent shall not be given without previous submission to the Chief and Tribe occupying such Reserve; Provided further that in the event of a disagreement on the matter submitted between the Chief and Tribe on the one part and the Resident Commissioner on the other, the matter in dispute shall be referred to the High Commissioner for his decision.”

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques (Bechuanaland Protectorate) Amendment Proclamation 1935 and shall have force and take effect from the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
