

HIGH COMMISSIONER'S NOTICE No. 191 of 1937.

BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.

CUSTOMS.

DUMPING DUTY ON CEMENT.

It is hereby notified for general information that, under and by virtue of the powers in him vested by section *fifteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, No. 20 of 1925, as amended, His Excellency the High Commissioner has been pleased to declare that, from and after the twenty-second day of October, 1937, there shall be charged, levied, collected and paid on cement (other than waterproofed Portland cement, coloured cement mixture, white Portland cement, red rapid-hardening Portland cement and coloured Portland cement) on importation into the Bechuanaland Protectorate from Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Estonia, Germany, Holland, Italy, Japan, the Province of Mozambique, Norway, Sweden, the United Kingdom and Yugoslavia an "ordinary" dumping duty equal to the difference between the "export price" as defined in section *thirteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, and the "domestic value" thereof as defined in that section, plus the extra cost of packing and packages for export, carriage to port of shipment and all other expenses incidental to placing such cement on board ship ready for export to the Bechuanaland Protectorate provided—

- (a) that such difference is greater than five per centum of the export price, and
- (b) that such duty shall not exceed one-half of the value for duty purposes, of the cement referred to above, as defined in section *fourteen* of the Customs Tariff and Excise Duties Amendment Proclamation, 1925, as amended, and
- (c) that such dumping duty shall not be imposed in respect of such cement shipped to the Bechuanaland Protectorate from Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Estonia, Germany, Holland, Italy, Japan, the Province of Mozambique, Norway, Sweden, the United Kingdom and Yugoslavia prior to the above-mentioned date.

High Commissioner's Notices Nos. 59 and 119 of 1926, Nos. 37 and 120 of 1927, No. 17 of 1931 and No. 184 of 1933 are hereby cancelled.
